#### **Speaker bios**

#### Päivi Mattila

Dr. Päivi Mattila holds a position of Director of Security Research Program at Laurea University of Applied Sciences (Finland), and she is responsible for quality and growth and strategic goals of security RD activities. Dr. Mattila is the coordinator of EU H2020 funded EU-HYBNET project. She is a Doctor of Philosophy (General History). Formerly she has worked as the head of the Project and Development Unit at the Crisis Management Centre Finland (CMC Finland) and in the Embassy of Finland in Tel Aviv and in the Finnish Institute in the Middle East alike in the Ministry for Foreign Affairs in Finland.

#### Jorge Garzon

Jorge Garzon is a civil servant attached to the French Ministry of the Interior, responsible of defining procurement strategy and monitoring performance. He is Coordinator of the EU iProcureNet project. He is actively working in implementing the innovation public procurement strategy for the French law enforcement services, facilitating access to VSE-SME to public procurement, reducing procurement costs, and supporting sustainable procurement. He graduated from the Faculty of Law and Economics at the University of Limoges (France) and holds a Master's degree in International Affairs and Finance. He has been a public purchaser for more than 10 years and has extensive experience in the field of purchasing and public administration.

#### Isto Mattila

Professor Isto Mattila works for international security research in the University of Turku, Finland in the Department of Information Technology. Prof. Mattila has wide working experience covering diverse assignments in different organisations national and international level. He is a Captain Navy, Finnish Border Guard. As from 2008 to 2014 he has worked for the European Commission, DG MARE. He was a second penholder for Maritime Security Strategy and designed new information sharing mechanism (CISE) between maritime authorities in EU, which is now hosted by EMSA. He has held the



position of R&D Director at Laurea UAS and he was the project coordinator of the AI-ARC Horizon 2020 project, which aims to build information sharing and anomaly detection to Arctic stakeholders.

#### **Pertti Woitsch**

Mr. Pertti Woitsch is an experienced security & defence industry professional with widespread expertise in international sales, marketing and business development with more than 40 years of business experience in a broad range of innovation driven industries. Pertti studied physics and computer science at the University of Helsinki. During his professional career, he has held management, sales, marketing, and business development positions, and been acting as chairman, director, CEO and strategic advisor in several companies in the security and defence industrial domain in Finland and abroad. #### **VENUE**


The 3<sup>rd</sup> ISW will take place at the Helsinki EU Office in Brussels, Belgium (Google Maps).

#### Arrival in Brussels

For those arriving from the Brussels International Airport (Zaventem):

- By Taxi or Uber/Bolt (approximately 40-60 euro, 30 mins)
- By bus number 12 (Airport Line) from the Airport to Schuman (€8; 30 min total). From Schuman take the metro to Arts-Loi (Line 1/5) and walk to the Helsinki EU Office (€2.10; 7 min total).
- By train from the Airport to Gare Centrale (€9; 20 mins). From Gare Centrale take the metro to Arts-Loi (Line 1/5) and walk to the Helsinki EU Office (€2.10; 7 min total).

For those arriving from Charleroi Airport:

- By Taxi/Uber/Bolt (80 100 euro, 1 hour)
- By Flibco to Gare du Midi (1 hour, 14 Euro)

For Those arriving from Gare du Midi (Train Station):




- take the metro to Arts-Loi (Line 2/6) and walk to the Helsinki EU Office (€2.10; 15 min total)

For bus and trams, it is possible to pay directly with your credit card on the voiture.









